Let the floor sander run up to full speed before lowering it carefully onto the surface. Be prepared for

Keep the floor sander moving across the floor all the time it is running do not let it stand still; it may

Let the weight of the floor sander do the work. Any extra pressure will overload the machine and may

Hold a small loop of the cable in the left hand, and then pass it over the left shoulder to keep the cable

If it is suspected that the cable may be cut or damaged in any way, switch off and unplug at the socket

before inspecting it. If the cable attached to the floor sander is damaged, stop using the machine. Contact the hire company. If an extension cable has been damaged do not use it again.

Vibration may affect the hands - watch out for signs. If the fingers start to tingle or feel numb, take a

To help prevent the effects of vibration, operate the machine for shorter periods. Keep hands warm -

Tilt the floor sander onto its back edge again before switching off and wait for it to stop completely

Make sure that any ventilation slots in the floor sander do not get blocked with sawdust.
